Brownsville is home to natural beauty and history. Brownsville's unique location offers proximity to South Padre Island and Mexico as well as its own amenities and activities. Tree-lined resacas, oxbow lakes nestled throughout neighborhoods, offer backyard recreation like kayaking and stand up paddleboarding. The Gladys Porter Zoo spans 28acres with lush tropical plants and some 1,600 animals. Art, history, and children's museums, two innovative libraries, and an observatory curate diverse exhibits. Health & Wellness

Brownsville is a two-time All American City award recipient and a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Culture of Health winner. The City's "Active Plan" is a blueprint for a 428-mile hike and bike trail network that will link the rich natural, cultural and historical resources—creating a regional identity for outdoor tourism, promoting healthier lifestyles, and generating a new sense of community pride.

Mobility & Transit

Brownsville has a robust multi-modal transportation system. The Brownsville/South Padre Island International Airport is constructing a modern 97,000 square-foot passenger terminal to better serve the functional and efficient needs of business and leisure travel. With thirteen bus routes, B-Metro is the largest mass transit system in the Rio Grande Valley, with hybrid busses to be added to the fleet in 2020. Three international ports of entry, including Brownsville & Matamoros International, Gateway International, and Veterans International Bridges, all connect with our sister City of Matamoros, Mexico. The Port of Brownsville, the only deep water port located on the U.S.-Mexico Border, reports an estimated \$3.6 billion in exported commodities as well as \$3.2 billion in imported commodities. Within the Port, Brownsville International Railway (BRG) transports goods such as steel, petroleum, agricultural and general products with an intermediate switch to Mexico.

The Brownsville Animal Regulation Care Center Assistant Director is responsible for overseeing the overall day to day management of the Animal Care, Customer Care, Behavior and Education of the Brownsville Animal Regulation Care Center. This position is responsible for assisting the Public Health Director in developing goals, preparing reports, providing related recommendations, coordinating with officials, and ensuring health compliance. The class researches and formulates long range goals for the organization; develops policy and position papers and supports the Public Health Director.

Model of Competencies



Key Functions:

- Evaluates and supervises staff to provide growth and maximize potential of all employees to facilitate the day-to-day operation.
- Assists Public Health Director with the selection and cultivation of qualified shelter operations staff, models effective behaviors and skills and builds morale among staff
- Evaluates areas relevant to shelter operations and programs, recommends revisions and implements changes accordingly
- Management and oversight of overall animal inventory, assuring the shortest length of stay in BARCC Shelter
- Assists and helps the director in the development and administration of departmental goals and objectives
- Assists and helps director in the preperation and monitoring of related reports including budgets and those submitted to the City Manager and City Commission
- Works with staff to create and implement operational protocols and procedures including, but not limitted to, euthanasia, adoptions, behavior evaluations, animal health, etc.
- Consistently strives to keep abreast of shelter operations, animal care, behavior, education, and welfare issues affecting the animal shelter.
- Assist staff when necessary with job related tasks. Assists with shelter tours, lectures, public education programs, special events, and fund raising activities as needed.
- Ensures appropriate supplies and equipment are available for effective shelter operations.
- Ensures all activities within the facility are conducted in a manner conductive to the safety and well-being of all employees, volunteers, visitors, customers, and animals.
- Provides on-call support to respond to shelter emergencies on an as needed basis.
- Develops and implements the Shelter Operations Business Plan & Annual Budget as approved by city commission.
- Ensures all operational reports are submitted to the Health Director in a timely manner.
- Provides on-call support to respond to shelter emergencies on an as needed basis.
- Conducts required board meetings of the advisory committee as required by regulations or city ordinances.
- · Assists with the development of administrative procedures for the department.
- Establishes long-range plans and programs, identifying funding sources, allocating funds for, and implementing longrange capital improvements, major equipment, and new technology systems that support goals and objectives of the organization.

• Requires Bachelor's degree in Public or Business Administration or business management related field.

• Must obtain before the end of 6 month orientation period: Animal Care Training Certificate, Animal Control Certificate, and Animal Euthanasia Technician Certification

Minimum Experience

• Minimum Five (5) years of Supervisory or Management experience in an animal facility

• Experience in working with government agencies, community groups volunteers, and animal welfare organizations.

Benefits:

The City of Brownsville participates in a generous retirement plan with retirement opportunities available at 5 or 20 years of continuous service. The City has an exceptional employee and family medical and dental insurance plan. Employees may also contribute to deferred compensation plans from Nationwide or VALIC or supplemental insurance plans from AFLAC and Colonial Life. Full time employees have the opportunity to accumulate 10 sick days and 10 annual days per year. Additionally, the City of Brownsville observes 12 holidays annually.
